**Calder** Arnauld Pierre,2009 Le sculpteur américain Alexander Calder (1898-1976) partage avec certains des plus grands créateurs du XXe siècle le redoutable privilège de la popularité universelle. Cette composition d'équilibres, c'est le mobile, où la cause du mouvement se confond si bien avec les bases constructives de l'œuvre qu'il lui paraît en quelque sorte immanent. Le mouvement est ainsi ce qui permet de maintenir dans le mobile. une forte référence au vivant, plus évidente encore lorsque l'artiste délaisse le vocabulaire géométrique du début des années 1930 pour entrer dans le cycle organique et s'inspirer des rythmes profonds du monde naturel. Avec ses mobiles, Calder invente un autre rapport à la réalité, fondée, justifiée et qualifiée tout à la fois par le mouvement. C'est à la tentative de définir cet autre réalisme qu'est consacré l'ouvrage d'Arnauld Pierre.

Calder's life takes on a transatlantic richness, from New York's Greenwich Village in the Roaring Twenties, to the Left Bank of Paris during the Depression, and then back to the United States, where the Calders bought a run-down old farmhouse in western Connecticut. New light is shed on Calder's lifelong interest in dance, theater, and performance, ranging from the Cirque Calder, the theatrical event that became his calling card in bohemian Paris to collaborations with the choreographer Martha Graham and the composer Virgil Thomson.
